Thought for the Month

I suspect most of us were shocked to see the images on the news of Notre Dame Cathedral burning on Monday 15th April.



A beautiful place of worship that has stood for centuries, devastated by fire.

In the days following, a number of news outlets stated that “There will be no Easter at Notre Dame this year”. But they were wrong.

Whilst there was no service in the cathedral, the worshippers from there met for mass at Saint-Eustache Church just down the road.

For the church is not the building, it is the people. We are fortunate to have a beautiful church to meet in, a visual symbol to the community around that can be seen all over the parish. But it is just bricks and mortar, stone, wood and glass. It is just a building. It’s what we do as a worshipping community that matters. It’s what we do to reach out into the world around, as a church as well as in our individual lives.

To quote the first line from Edward Burn’s great hymn “We have a Gospel to proclaim, good news for all throughout the earth.”

The challenge is for each of us, to play our part, to spread the good news, and to bring others into a relationship with God.
